

Steps to follow to obtain a Quebec driver's licence. (The driver's course is compulsory since January 17, 2010)

INFORMATION

Anyone sixteen (16) years of age or older, not having a learner's licence prior to January 17, 2010, must take the driver's education course (theory and practice).

The new course is spread over a period of twelve (12) months : twenty-four (24) hours of theory and fifteen (15) hours of practice, in alternation. Refer to Road Safety Education Program schedule.

The student has two (2) textbooks to purchase prior to the first theory class. They are available in bookstores, at

REGISTRATION (CONTRACT)

The student can register with the office clerk at the school board's head office in Ville-Marie or at the secretary's office at École Gilbert-Théberge in Témiscaming.

If the student is under eighteen (18) years of age, his parent or tutor must be present when signing the contract and payment of the first installment of \$250.00 is due.

To get into the course, a student can register six (6) months prior to his/her sixteenth (16th) birthday. A student is allowed to follow the theory classes prior to turning sixteen (16). A person must complete first twelve (12) hours of theory before claiming a learner's licence at the Société de l'assurance automobile du Québec office (SAAQ).

The total cost of the driver's education course is \$1 000.00 payable in four (4) installments of \$250.00 each at the beginning of each phase. See chart titled « 12-Month Timeline »

Should a student driver **cancel a class without prior notice (twenty-four hours), a \$60.00 fee will apply.**

A full description of the driver's course will be made at the beginning of Phase I. It is strongly recommended that a parent or tutor attend this session.

COURSE START-UP

The student will be advised by mail, just once, as to when the first theory class will begin.
